The Folly of “Praise Worship”

In today’s religions, “praise worship” [groups leading during song service, clapping hands, shouting] is added to many denominational services. Accompaniment of bands, instrumental music contribute to the program of entertainment. The reasoning? Traditional worship is boring and not working! God speaking, or man?

Who set the guidelines that determine the way our worship to God is to be presented? God or man? God defined the avenues of worship within the scriptures, and any change reflects a concept of a self instilled righteousness of men. Paul writes of this type of attitude in Romans 10:1-3, “Brethren, my heart’s desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved. **For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge.** For they being ignorant of God’s righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God.” [emphasis added]. Our attitude must be based upon knowledge of God’s word, and it must be done with the right attitude. To add anything new to the worship of God, and call it worship is to create our own righteousness. To place things in worship because the “old” way is not meeting needs, is boring or is “not working” is to have the wrong attitude in worship. When we worship, it is all about God, not about self. We worship God because He is worthy of our worship. Psalm 18:3.

“Let all things be done decently and in order,” 1 Corinthians 14:40. The Bible says that when we make music in worship to God it is to be through singing: “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord,” Colossians 3:16, see also, Ephesians 5:19. To sing, one needs to have words or lyrics. Whistling is not singing; humming is not singing; clapping is not singing. In Psalm 85:8, it says, “I will hear what God the Lord will speak: for he will speak peace unto his people, and to his saints: but let them not turn again to folly.” “Folly” as defined by the Thesaurus is foolishness, idiocy, and recklessness; i.e., senselessness, thoughtlessness. The antonym of the word is “wisdom.” How wise are those who give authority for “praise worship” in their attempt to honor God? All the ways that man tries to add to worship adds to his own self-righteousness to the worship of God.

We must make sure that our worship is pleasing to God and not pleasing to self. We must worship in the way that God has taught us to worship. God has taught us to worship Him with **singing that teaches and admonishes**. God’s Word does not give inspired words that suggest His acceptance of this manner of worship. Apostle John exhorts us, “By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name,” Hebrews 13:25. “Prove all things; hold fast that which is good,” 1 Thessalonians 5:21.

“Udenoninational Christianity”

What denomination were Matthew, James, Peter, and Paul members of? Finding the answer to this question will change your concept of Christianity.

Even the casual reader of the Bible realizes that the hierarchy of modern religion, complete with a clergy/laity relationship is vastly different from Christianity one reads about in the Bible. He sees the simplicity of worship in the Bible and marvels at how much has changed as he looks at modern religion. He does not have to be a great scholar to see that the moral precepts found in the Bible are ignored by those who claim to follow Jesus, and are being replaced by a new moral ethic with everyone free to determine right and wrong.

To have udenominational Christianity one must go back beyond the start of all denominations. He must go back beyond all ecclesiastical gatherings of church leaders which result in changes to what Jesus had in mind. Jesus came to establish the church (Matthew 16:18), and gave His blood to purchase it (Acts 20:28).

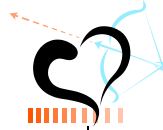
- If you plant **honesty**, you will reap **trust**.

“But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. God gives the increase, 1 Corinthians 3:6.

- **I will not strike back.** If someone is rude, if someone is impatient, if someone is unkind, I will not respond in that way. “Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord,” Romans 12:19.

- **I will go the second mile.** I will find ways to help share the burden of another person. “And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain,” Matthew 5:41.
- **I will forgive.** I will forgive those who hurt me. “Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do,” Luke 23:34.
- **I will secretly do something kind for someone.** I will reach out anonymously and bless the life of another. “And be ye kind one to another tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ’s sake hath forgiven you,” Ephesians 5:32.
- **I will treat others the way I wish to be treated.** I will practice “the Golden Rule.” “Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets,” Matthew 7:12.

What Can Happen Because of Your Friendship?

It is important for everyone to know the tremendous power of friendship. You being a true Christian friend to someone else can cause good things to happen in their lives. I personally don't know where I would be today were it not for the powerful influence of my friends. Family and friends are those who know you the best, and love you anyway. Friends and family are those who come in when the rest of the world goes out. You are blessed if you have friends, and you are a blessing if you are a friend to others. What can happen because of your friendship?

Because of your friendship others may choose God: Naomi's influence was so strong that Ruth chose her God (Ruth 1:16-18). Your influence can cause others to choose God. Your influence can cause a friend who believes in Jesus to be stronger in the Lord.

Because of your friendship others can be refreshed: "For we have great joy and consolation in your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed by you, brother" (Philemon 7, NKJV). John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." "Believing" develops faith – "I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am he, ye shall die in your sins," John 8:24.

Believing and faith in God's Word advances the desire to do all that God has commanded. Building on the desire to have that "everlasting life," a home in heaven, requires that we follow through with God's commands in obtaining salvation. In his sermon on Mars' hill, Paul said, "And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth all men everywhere to repent: because he hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man [Christ.ed] whom he hath ordained; whereof he hath given assurance unto all men, in that he hath raised him from the dead," Acts 17:30-31. In Jesus' own words in Luke 13:3, He says, "I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." A part of repentance and godly sorrow is confessing your belief "that God hath raised him from the dead ... for with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation," Romans 10:9-10. Jesus says, "Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven," Matthew 10:32-33.

This faith and belief requires the believer to do all that is commanded in the Gospel of Christ, the death, burial and resurrection of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ. This includes the baptism, immersion, that washes away sins and saves, "The like figure whereunto even baptism doth also now save us (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), by the resurrection of Jesus Christ," 1 Peter 3:21. Jesus commands it, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned," Mark 16:16.

And the blessing received is, "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new," 2 Corinthians 5:17. The promise of Christ is given in Revelation 2:10, "... be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." Christians are commanded to "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost," Matthew 28:19. Becoming a Christian is just the beginning. Verse 20 of Matthew 28 reads, "Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world," for example, worship, benevolence, evangelism, and edification.

WHERE IN THE BIBLE WILL I FIND . . . THE CHURCH'S MISSION?



...Since the church belongs to Christ by reason of the purchase price He paid (Acts 20:28), He has the right and the authority to determine its mission. The church has not been authorized by its founder to provide entertainment, to revolutionize the world politically or to become "user friendly!" The church may have – and in many cases has had – a bearing on each of these areas. But these are not the primary reasons for the church's existence. The church of Jesus Christ has been commissioned of God to reach the lost – both the alien sinner and the erring child of God.

Matthew ends his gospel record with these words: "Go therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world" (Matt. 28:19-20). James encourages all Christians – not just elders and preachers – to bring back into the fold erring brothers. "Brethren, if any of you do err from the truth, and one convert him; let him know, that he which converts a sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins" (James 5:19-20). God's people have a sacred obligation to build each other up in the most holy faith. Elders obviously must provide the leadership in this as in other areas of Christian stewardship. But every Christian should help his brother and sister to grow in grace and in knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18). "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and good works: not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another; and so much more, as you see the day approaching" (Heb. 10:24-25). The body of Christ must look after the physical needs of our own brothers and sisters in Christ (Gal. 6:10). But our responsibilities for helping the needy extends far beyond our own members. "Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unaware. Remember them that are in bonds, as with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body" (Heb. 13:2-3). –*Where In The Bible Will I Find...*, I. D. Byars, Volume 1, pp. 260.

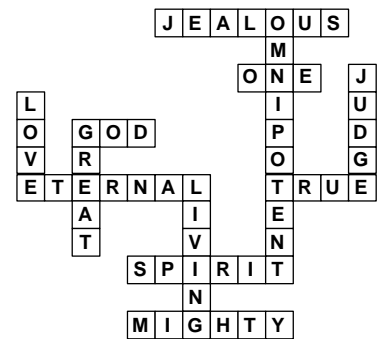
